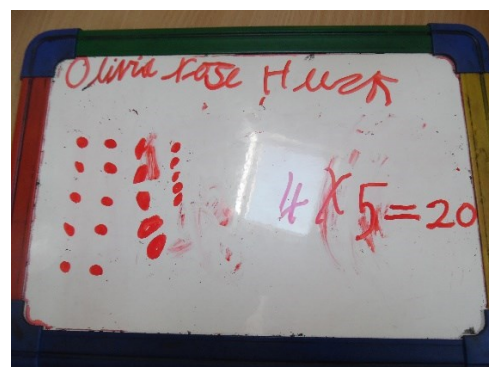
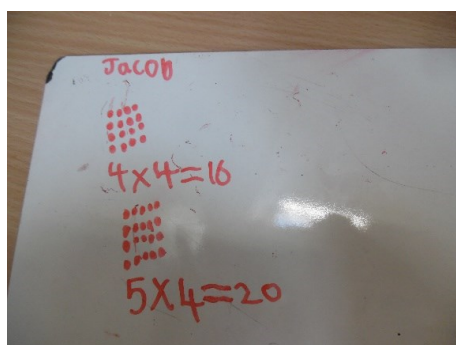
Please remember if we are not in your child's school, on a particular day, we can still be contacted via the school office.
